There will also be a school fair on 8th April.


A small group of School community members is also working on the preparation of a School history. The group is keen to get in touch with any former students, families and others with an association with the School.

Family Day Care is a government supported child care service which is conducted from carers' homes for small groups of children.

There is a strong demand in the community for Family Day Care, and the Hobart City Council is looking for committed and enthusiastic people in all areas who could provide quality child care from home. Family Day Carers are self-employed, and can work the days and hours that suit themselves and their families. Carers can also set their own hourly rate; a typical fee for four children in care would be a total of \$18.00 per hour.

Potential carers need to have experience with children and an understanding of their development. Some essential resources and equipment, plus training and support are provided by a team of Coordination Unit staff.

GAS ROLLOUT



Well – the rollout has commenced but there has been no attempt to sell the idea of connecting to gas to

the community. Will all of Mount Stuart be able to connect? Will households who already have gas appliances be offered incentives to change over to reticulated gas?

WHAT IF?

An issue which we think needs to be addressed is the failure of the Hobart City Council and the State Government to address provision of alternative routes to Davey and Macquarie Streets. If one or both of those streets is blocked, Hobart would virtually come to a standstill. A closure would not only affect City of Hobart residents, but residents of surrounding municipalities. How would residents of South Hobart get to Glenorchy or the Eastern Shore if Macquarie St was blocked between Molle Street and the Southern Outlet? Imagine all the traffic from Kingston and places south travelling down Proctors Rd into Sandy Bay, or up the Channel Highway and through Sandy Bay.

The late Don Birch of Lenah Valley was a proponent of a bypass to the West of the City, but this has been stymied by the gazetting of Wellington Park.

Which leaves us with what?

- A tunnel, but this is very expensive to build and maintain
- A flyover, but this would be an eyesore and expensive to build
- A major resumption of properties to provide a bypass
- Ferries from Kettering and Peppermint Bay
- Trains, but there are none south and east of Hobart, except the Ida Bay railway!

The last infrastructure planning for Hobart was probably done in the five years following the end of World War II, which resulted in land being set aside for the Brooker Highway, the Southern Outlet and the Eastern Outlet. Those planners had considerable foresight, but did not foresee the growth in population and traffic.

It's time the Tasmanian Government and the Hobart City Council did some real infrastructure planning.

METRO BUS SERVICES

Thanks to those who responded re the Metro bus service to Mount Stuart, (or lack of it), especially on weekends. This was the major complaint. We have passed your concerns on to Metro and are waiting on a response.

The School will be getting two terrapin classrooms next year, to cater for an additional class and one of the classes at present in the old Library. This will enable the Library to be moved back to its rightful much bigger home.

The Education Department will undertake a major review of the School next year, as some facilities are below standard or too small. The review will incorporate planning for at least two permanent classrooms.

As part of the review, moving the Kindergarten from its stand-alone premises to Gillon Cres will also be considered.
