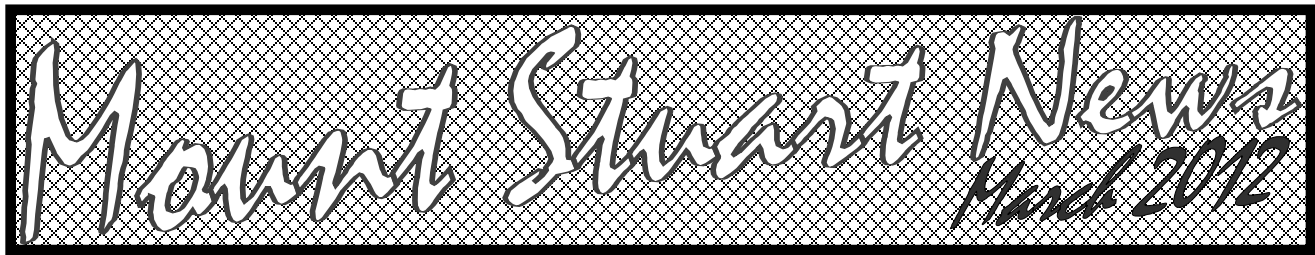

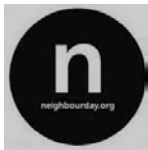
AN INVITATION...

HALL PLANS

It started with a simple plan for a request to the Council for a toilet downstairs, off the supper room of the Hall. However the whole project has mushroomed as the Council is required to provide an accessible toilet for the disabled, which is better placed upstairs.

HCC representatives have attended our meetings with plans for the new facilities – a smaller kitchen and one unisex toilet off the supper room; an accessible toilet, cleaning cupboard and upgraded men's and women's toilets off the entrance to the dance hall. The toilet for the disabled has to have access for the disabled from a car park; which means building a new ramp into the main hall and substantial site works. All this will make the hall more attractive to hirers and bring it up to current standards.



NEW BLOOD REQUIRED

At last year's AGM, the president and secretary of the Progress Association both agreed to continue in their roles only until replacements were found. However, one year on, they are still in these roles. We need new members: fresh ideas, fresh insights. MOUNT STUART NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH CRIME REPORT

Gordon Ave: On 1/11/11 a vehicle was stolen from outside the owner's residence. Nothing was seen or heard and it has not been recovered. (431872)

Benjafield Terrace: On 16/11/11 a locked car was stolen and later recovered on the Eastern Shore with such extensive damage that it was written off. (432889)

Mount Stuart Road: On 17/11/11 a locked car was stolen from the street outside the owner's residence. The vehicle was recovered on the Eastern Shore with moderate damage. Four males were seen running into bushland but it was not possible to apprehend them. (432988)

Toorak Ave: On 18/01/12 a securely locked vehicle was stolen and was later located in the Glenorchy area, in a driveable condition. (436906)

Rupert Ave: On 5/02/12 a vehicle parked outside a residence was entered. Nothing was stolen although property was moved around.
