VALE ROBIN HOOD

A long time resident in Elphinstone Road, Robin Hood, O.A., died on August 8th.

He was well known for his involvement in a range of activities over a long period of time and St David's Cathedral was filled for his valedictory service.

Robin came from a family property, The Braes, in the northern Midlands and, at the tender age of nine, began life as a boarder at Launceston Church Grammar School. Despite the fact that both of his parents died while he was still at school, he continued and finished his education at Grammar, being, among other things, captain of the school cricket, football and athletic teams and joint head prefect.

Following matriculation he attended Melbourne University on a scholarship, sitting at the feet of Dr Frank Duras, the most influential figure in the development of physical education in Australia's history.

On returning to Tasmania he began his long career as a Physical Education teacher with the Education Department; initially in Burnie, but much of it in schools in the south of the state; more particularly at Cosgrove High School and Hobart Matriculation College.

Good at football, tennis and, later, at bowls, it was his extracurricular contribution to and involvement in the organisation and administration of light athletics, both in Tasmania and at the national level over some 40 years from the late 1950s to the early 1990s, that was little short of outstanding.

As President, Vice President and/or Life Member of the Sandy Bay Harriers, Athletics South, the Tasmanian and Australian Amateur Athletics Associations, he also officiated as starter (assisted for many years locally by Mr Littlejohn) at countless events on multiple occasions both here and interstate.

Robin Hood, 'Hoodie' to countless friends and acquaintances, was a member of the Rotary Club of Hobart for more than 30 years. No mere card carrying member, 'service above self', Rotary's guiding principle, was said to be 'part of his DNA'. An impeccable attendance record, involvement in all aspects

of his club's life, support for a wide range of club functions and a list of roles undertaken, saw him acknowledged as a Paul Harris Fellow in 1994 and with the club's highest award, 'Honorary Membership', in 2012.

Most recently the Rotary Club saw fit to acknowledge Hoodie's more-than-18-year involvement in its Art Show Committee, a major fundraiser for the club, with the decision to institute the 'Robin Hood Memorial Prize' at the club's annual art show.

We extend our sympathy to his wife, Pat, and to their children, Jenny and Stuart and their families.

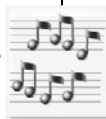
REMEMBRANCE DAY FAMILY CONCERT

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir/Madam

On 18 July a meeting of interested
residents of Mount Stuart/West
Hobart, jointly convened by the
Hobart City Council and the EPA
Division of DIPWE, was held at the
Mount Stuart School. The meeting,
under the banner of 'Burn Brighter
this winter' was scheduled to take
little more than an hour; and it didn't!

Some 500 residents of Mount Stuart/West
Hobart -- householders with wood heaters --
had, like myself, been informed of the meeting
via a letterbox drop, and invited to attend.
Light refreshments were available, too.

The meeting was addressed by some seven
specialist speakers, all but one of them with a
PowerPoint presentation, on subjects such as
Smoke Reduction Programs in Tasmania,
Health Aspects of Wood Smoke, and Why
Wood Heaters Smoke.

How many of the several hundred residents of
Mount Stuart who were informed of the
meeting availed themselves of the opportunity
to learn a little more about 'how much smoke
there is really'? Six. Less than 2% of those
informed and invited to attend; less than the
number of presenters, who had given up
more than their evening!

I find the apathy of the other 98% of invited
residents of this superb part of Hobart quite
appalling. More evidence of this apathy
needed? How many take the trouble to:

* turn up for the annual meeting of their
Progress Association? About 20!

* give up a couple of hours once a month to
serve on either of the Progress Association
or the Community Service Association

executive committees? You can count them
on two hands.

* give the Leonard Wall/Valley Street
Reserve Bushcare Group an hour or three
of their time on a Sunday afternoon once a
month? A handful at most!

*offer the Council their time and talents on
one of the many Council committees: 50 &
Better Centre; Hobart Older Persons
Reference Group? The list goes on! More
and more community organisations.
Relatively, fewer and fewer community
offers of support.

Do you have a vision for the Mount Stuart of
the future? Some kind of development plan?

How should it develop? What should be the
role of the Progress Association? How do
we attract younger members? Greater
diversity on the Executive Committee?

There is, at least, one forthcoming occasion
where you can air your views: some of
these issues are likely to be raised at a
community forum in the Town Hall on
Tuesday, 9 October 2012, sponsored by the
Hobart Council of Community Associations.
If you are interested in attending, please let
the undersigned know.

***MOUNT STUART NEIGHBOURHOOD
WATCH CRIME REPORT***

26th June – 27th August

Muir Court: On 6/7/12 a locked, secure vehicle was entered by forcing the door lock and ignition. Nothing was stolen. (447503)

Augusta Road: On 12/7/12 a securely locked car was stolen from outside a residence. It was discovered in Rokeby, completely destroyed by fire. (447849)

Dale Crescent: On 19/7/12 entry was forced to a house. Initially a glass panel by the front door was smashed but because of the deadlocked door, the burglars were unsuccessful. They then gained entry by smashing a side window. Property was moved but nothing appeared to be stolen. (448237)

Mount Stuart Road: On 21/7/12 entry was forced to a house through a rear sliding door. Nothing appeared to be stolen. (448328)

Gillon Crescent: On 28/7/12 an attempt was made to enter the Mount Stuart School by forcing a window. The window was damaged but entry was not gained. Nothing was seen or heard. (448678)

Mortimer Avenue: On 4/8/12 a securely locked car was entered through a window and attempts were made to steal it. Nothing was stolen but the ignition barrel was damaged. (449060)

Auvergne Avenue: On 5/8/12 attempts were made to steal a locked vehicle. It was located nearby with no damage. (449116)

Darling Parade: On 11/8/12 and 15/8/12 arson attempts were made at the Mount Stuart hall,



one involving escape doors to the hall and adjacent park equipment and the other near the supper room doorway. (449675)

Mount Stuart Road: On 13/8/12 a male intruder was disturbed in a home by the owners. He has been charged with aggravated burglary. (449470)

Mount Stuart Road: On 19/8/12 intruders forced entry to a camper and stole electrical items. They then set fire to a cushion but fortunately this extinguished itself. (449831)

Mount Stuart Road: On 19/8/12 personal cards and cash were stolen from a car parked in a driveway. (450145)

TRAFFIC REPORT



The recent meeting of the Mount Stuart Residents' Traffic Committee with HCC representatives had several matters to discuss, including those perennial issues like traffic volume and speed.

Traffic around the school at drop off and pick up time is still a problem, especially in Weerona Avenue. The HCC is to monitor the area and install a 40 kph sign there if a need is seen. Concern was also expressed about the intersection of Byard Street and Raymont Terrace where there are many near misses as Byard Street traffic fails to give way. A Stop sign has been suggested instead of the Give Way sign.



A pedestrian refuge, necessary to allow safer crossing of Mount Stuart Road, is planned between Mellifont and Byard Street. If there are any areas that need better illumination at night, please contact us and report potholes needing attention to HCC on 6238 2836.
