WHAT'S IN A NAME?

The Mount Stuart Progress Association has served our suburb since the early post-World War II years. "Progress" evokes images of the rapid suburban growth of those years; the establishment of a primary school, Memorial Hall and kindergarten. Progress Associations sprang up in communities all around Australia, but few such groups retain that name today.

The Committee of the Association believes it is now time for a name change, and proposes **Mount Stuart Residents Inc.** We hope the new name picks up the idea that it is **your** Association if you live in Mount Stuart, and that you have an interest in a body that will represent the interests of your community – not only its progress and development, but also its future as a sustainable living place – a place where environment and heritage are guarded and where people matter.

To change our name, we must alter the Constitution. We will foreshadow this, first in this newsletter, and formally at the Annual General Meeting on Thursday 27th March.

At the same time it is proposed to:

- Change the name of the Mount Stuart Community Service Association Inc. (our linked body which, in particular, runs the Community Hall) to **Mount Stuart Hall Inc.**
- Update the Constitutions of both bodies through several minor changes, including:
 - A slight rewording of our aims
 - Stating that membership is open to all residents and property owners in the suburb of Mount Stuart as defined in the Central Plan Register.

Proposed changes will be further outlined at the Annual General Meeting, and voted on at Special General Meetings on a date to be advised. Why not plan to attend the meetings? Help make our Association an effective residents' body for the twenty-first century!
