Farewell Gwenda Quon

15 September 1929 to 19 May 2018

Mount Stuart lost yet another valued long-term resident with the recent death of Gwenda Quon. She had lived in Mount Stuart for 66 years.

When she was growing up Gwenda, nee Brown, lived at 99 Bathurst St, which was then a butcher's shop owned by her mother's family and with an engineering business owned by her father at the rear.

Gwenda met Kevin at ballroom dancing and they were married in 1952, and shortly after that moved into the house they built at 18 Benjafield Tce. They had four children, Michael, Jenny (Dix), David and Colin. In the late 1980s they bought a block of land at 37 Benjafield Tce and had a new house built on this, moving in in 1990 and selling the old place.

As well as raising their four children, Gwenda became involved in many activities and organisations including caverneering, ballroom dancing with Rosemary and Kawarra Dance Clubs, Mothers Club (now Child Health), Mount Stuart Progress Association, Mount Stuart Primary School Parents & Friends, Girl Guides, Rotariannes (Rotary members' wives) Club of Moonah, Meals on Wheels, Probus Club of New Town, Probus Club of Lenah Valley, walking and playing tennis.

Gwenda's health deteriorated over the past two or three years, resulting in a loss of sight and then some hearing. Despite this, she tried to get out to walk and talk regularly and was still actively involved with Probus. Our condolences to her husband Kevin, four children, six grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Crime Report 14 May-1 September

There has been in small increase in the number of crimes reported this period, from five to eight. They are also more serious.

Protecting our heritage



Following on the article on 55 Mount Stuart Road in the last newsletter, Mount Stuart Residents Inc wrote to the Minister for Planning, recommending the following:

1 - Penalties under the Historic Cultural Heritage Act and the Land Use Planning Approvals Amendment Act of 2013 (LUPAA) for illegally damaging or demolishing heritage-listed buildings be amended so that they are consistent.

2 – A maximum fine per offence of 5,000 units (currently \$795,000). At present the maximum fine per offence under LUPAA is only 500 units (\$79,500).

3 - The Resource Management and Appeals Tribunal or the Courts be permitted to declare that a place on which an offence has been committed "not be developed, or used, or shall be used only in accordance with conditions specified in the order" for a period up to 10 years. At present Section 74 of the Historic Cultural Heritage Act allows the Planning Minister to make an order prohibiting an owner convicted of an offence relating to the damage or destruction of, or damage to, a heritage place from carrying out works on the site for up to five years. LUPAA has no penalties apart from the fine or fines.

We are waiting for a response from the Minister.
