Improving our Playgrounds



Rosina Court Playground

With its long blue slide and climbing wall plus a grassy oval, the Mount Stuart Park at the end of Benjafield Terrace is well known and well utilised. Toilet and barbecue facilities along with the playground and open space make it a practical place for picnics, birthday parties, family get togethers and other occasions.

But did you know that there are two, perhaps less well-known parks in the suburb? One is located behind the Mount Stuart Hall in Darling Parade and the other, tucked away in Rosina Court. The hall park, with a basketball ring along with several different items of play equipment and a picnic table, is a City of Hobart park convenient for hall hirers and the general public throughout the year. It is certainly a popular place on the night of the Christmas carols. The smaller park in Rosina Court, with an infant swing and a spring rocker, boasts a wonderful view over the city and River Derwent.



There's Something About Mount Stuart



A recent article by Jarrad Bevan in the *Sunday Tasmanian* reported on data gathered by the real estate agency PropTrack.

Their figures show that homeowners in Mount Stuart hold on to their houses for longer than in any other suburb in Tasmania. The latest figures show house owners in this city suburb average 12.67 years before selling their property.

The median price for houses has risen from under half a million dollars a decade ago to over one million.

Local real estate agent Bec Owens identified some of the

attractions of Mount Stuart: "This is a family area, where younger couples buy a home and then start a family.

"You are close to the city, there is a highly regarded school, and compared to neighbouring West Hobart, Mount Stuart took longer for prices to boom," she said. "That gave people the opportunity to get a foot on the ladder."

A New Park Seat and a Memorial

This attractive seat was installed on 4th July, at the start of the Fiona Allan Walk. It replaces three older, deteriorating ones in the area.

A plaque will be added, in memory of Linley Grant, a tireless worker in Mount Stuart and in wider Hobart and Tasmanian communities.

Three of the organisations with which Linley was involved: the National Council of Women Tasmania Inc., Girl Guides Tasmania and the Mount Stuart Residents Inc., provided sponsorship for the plaque prior to its approval by Hobart City Council.
